CODE OF CONDUCT - KEY STAGE 4

KS4 CODE OF CONDUCT

- involve myself positively and cooperatively in Physical Education sessions in order to develop key life skills and promote my own physical, social and emotional health
- abide by the school's 'Acceptable Use' policy
- check my school email at least daily
- inform someone responsible of any concerns I may have regarding another student
- report any instances of bullying

I acknowledge that to develop my **ORGANISATION SKILLS** I am expected to:

- attend lessons punctually;

- ensure that if I need to ask subject teachers for help with homework tasks, this should be done as early as possible during the period in which the set work should be done, so that official deadlines can still be met;

- make sure, as far as possible, that printing / technology issues do not prevent me submitting or presenting work;
- make every effort to contact fellow students and teachers if I have been absent from school, in order to find out details of work missed so that I can catch up as quickly and effectively as possible.

I recognise that to meet expectations regarding **ACADEMIC HONESTY**, I should <u>not</u>:

- copy other students' work
- copy material from a source acknowledging it
- use references without citing them properly through annotation / footnotes and references in a bibliography

I understand that failure to adhere to these expectations in class work, homework and examinations will result in sanctions and my parents being informed. A note would be made on my academic record that might influence any applications / references.

I understand that copying / cheating in tests / examinations will result in a 'Fail' grade, and that in external examination sessions, this could jeopardise my results.

I accept the terms of the **Acceptable Use Agreement** so that I may make use of the network and associated technologies at school and home.

I accept that I will follow the school rules both in school and on school trips. I accept that

- I am not permitted to consume alcoholic beverages, take drugs or smoke on excursions.
- I may not leave the main groups during activities.
- I may be given an opportunity for shopping and sightseeing without direct supervision and during such times I should remain in groups of no less than three.
- on residential trips, I must respect the 'lights out' time and respect other students and guests in the hotel. I must remain in my allocated room after 'lights out' time.
- if students are travelling by coach/car then I must wear my seatbelts at all times.
- I must make my bags and any other possession available to staff for searches in the unlikely event that I am suspected of breaching the Code of Conduct.
- in the highly unlikely event of me behaving in an unacceptable manner, the School reserves the right to send me home at the expense of my parents.

I appreciate that in abiding by the terms of this contract, I can rely upon the full support of my subject teachers, Form Tutor and the management team of the school, and that they will do all they can to encourage and enable me not only to set high standards for myself, but to work with positive focus to attain them.
